

FROM THE DESK OF THE PASTOR | DESDE EL ESCRITORIO DEL PARRACO



Friends we are almost at the end of the Church's liturgical year C. The readings for this weekend focus on the end times. In the Gospel, Jesus and his disciples are in the temple of Jerusalem, and people are commenting how beautiful it is. It is adorned with precious stones and votive offerings. The Jerusalem temple was the pride of every Jew, Jesus and his disciples included. It took years to build at tremendous cost and effort. It was a symbol of Israel's faith in God and at the same time a sign of Jewish identity. The temple was massive, glorious, and good. So, when Jesus tells his disciples that it would soon be destroyed, that there would not be one stone left upon another, we can be sure that his disciples were deeply shaken. The sign of their faith, the sign of their nation, would all be taken away! Now this gospel is not only about the temple of Jerusalem or Jews of the first century. It is about us. We are to see in the temple a sign of the good things in our life, the things that we care for, the things we take pride in, the things we have built by our hands. This gospel reminds us that those good and glorious things can be taken away.

Friends, we might have pride in our work, in the job we have performed well and faithfully for years, in the company that we built by our own ideas and efforts. And then, because of a mistake, someone's dishonesty, or downsizing, our livelihood is taken away. We no longer have an income and work that gives us satisfaction. Jesus tells us that when our life falls apart, God will not forget us. When the things we take pride in are destroyed, it is then time to place our pride in God's faithfulness. When we feel alone and powerless, then we must believe that God's power is real and active. The most important line in the gospel is the last line where Jesus says "...by your perseverance you will secure your lives." Perseverance means our ability to hold on, to trust in God's care. We cannot always rebuild the good things in our life that are destroyed, but we can continue to live. The Jews were never able to rebuild the temple in Jerusalem, but they continue to flourish as a people in our world today. So can we. When our life lies in ruins, then it is time to trust, then it is time to persevere, then it is time to hold on, believing that by the grace of God we can secure our lives. God Bless! Fr. Eric

Amigos, estamos casi al final del año litúrgico C de la Iglesia. Las lecturas de este fin de semana se centran en el fin de los tiempos. En el Evangelio, Jesús y sus discípulos están en el templo de Jerusalén, y la gente comenta su belleza. Está adornado con piedras preciosas y ofrendas votivas. El templo de Jerusalén era el orgullo de todo judío, incluidos Jesús y sus discípulos. Su construcción requirió años de trabajo y un enorme esfuerzo. Era un símbolo de la fe de Israel en Dios y, a la vez, un signo de la identidad judía. El templo era imponente, glorioso y hermoso. Por eso, cuando Jesús les dice a sus discípulos que pronto sería destruido, que no quedaría piedra sobre piedra, podemos estar seguros de que sus discípulos quedaron profundamente conmovidos. ¡Desaparecería, el signo de su fe, el signo de su nación, ¡Ahora bien, este evangelio no trata solo del templo de Jerusalén ni de los judíos del siglo I. Trata sobre nosotros. En el templo debemos ver un símbolo de las cosas buenas de nuestra vida: aquello que nos importa, de lo que nos enorgullecemos, lo que hemos construido con nuestras propias manos. Este evangelio nos recuerda que esas cosas buenas y gloriosas se nos pueden quitar.

Amigos, aplicándolo a nuestra vida: Nosotros, podemos sentirnos orgullosos de nuestro trabajo, del empleo que hemos desempeñado bien y fielmente durante años, de lo que hemos construido con nuestras propias ideas y esfuerzos. Y por un error, o la deshonestidad de alguien o una difamación personal, perdiéramos nuestro sustento. Ya no tenemos un ingreso, ni un trabajo que nos dé satisfacción. Jesús nos dice que cuando nuestra vida se desmorona, Dios no nos olvidará. Cuando aquello de lo que nos enorgullecemos es destruido, es momento de depositar nuestro orgullo en la fidelidad de Dios. Cuando nos sentimos solos e impotentes, debemos creer que el poder de Dios es real y activo. La frase más importante del evangelio es la última, donde Jesús dice: «.....Si se mantienen firmes, conseguirán la vida». Perseverancia significa nuestra capacidad de resistir, de confiar en el cuidado de Dios. No siempre podemos reconstruir lo bueno que se destruye en nuestra vida, pero podemos seguir viviendo. Los judíos nunca pudieron reconstruir el templo de Jerusalén, pero siguen prosperando como pueblo en nuestro mundo. Nosotros también podemos. Cuando nuestra vida está en ruinas, es tiempo de confiar, es tiempo de perseverar, es tiempo de aferrarnos, creyendo que por la gracia de Dios podemos salvar nuestras vidas. ¡Que Dios los bendiga! P.
